

Environmental Policy

Guernsey Ports recognises that aviation and maritime operations play a vital role in the economic, environmental and social life of the surrounding island community.

This Environmental Policy is Guernsey Ports' statement of commitment to exercising our responsibilities of environmental stewardship, regulatory compliance and sustainable development for the benefit of Guernsey Ports, its business and the people linked with its operation and activities, as well as our wider island community. Our core business activities include aviation and maritime operations, property management, the management of a diverse range of commercial concessions, and the delivery of several public service obligations all of which are within the scope of this Environmental Policy.

Guernsey Ports is committed to:

- Reducing carbon emissions, to meet a goal of Net Zero by 2050;
- Minimising waste, consumption and preventing pollution;
- Optimising energy and water use;
- Protecting biodiversity and managing biosecurity risks;
- Driving continual improvements.
- Meeting or exceeding the applicable environmental legislation, international aviation and maritime standards, and local regulatory requirements.

Guernsey Ports will do this by:

- Understanding and measuring our environmental aspects;
- Setting targets and Key Performance Indicators, and monitoring and reporting against them;
- Maintaining, developing and implementing management and control methods which prevent or minimise our environmental impacts;
- Developing an Environmental Management System (EMS) as a framework for continual improvement around regulatory compliance, management of environmental risks and operational performance;
- Ensuring clear accountability and management responsibility for the environmental performance of the business;
- Developing a sustainable procurement policy;
- Maintaining open communication pathways with Guernsey Ports stakeholders, ensuring transparency and consideration of external factors;
- Strengthening our contribution to the local community.

This policy, together with the mechanisms to manage and control our environmental aspects will be reviewed on an annual basis to ensure that Guernsey Ports continuously looks to improve its environmental performance. Revisions and targets will be documented.

Guernsey Ports recognises the value of communicating these commitments to the Ports Board, employees, business partners, tenants and other external stakeholders. This policy statement will be made available to all.

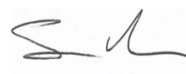
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
